

## Breaking open the Word

### 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Reflection

Jesus' invitation to "Follow me" is addressed to everyone. Our baptism begins our paschal journey with Jesus and initiates our response to follow Jesus "to Jerusalem." We spend our whole lives working out what began at baptism; following Jesus through death into life. We spend our whole lives learning how to be resolutely determined and faithful on our journey.

Jesus invites us to follow him in the ordinary circumstances of our lives. This is where the going gets tough: not in the extraordinary, but in the ordinary things do we witness to our faithful following. Sometimes when we read the Scriptures we might be discouraged by the leadership of the prophets or early disciples. We always need extraordinary leaders to help us know where we are going in following Jesus. But the church is mostly made up of ordinary people whose very faithfulness to the gospel is an extraordinary way to follow Jesus.

## Thirteenth Week of Ordinary Time

During this week the stories from Genesis tell us of Abraham's relationship with the Lord, from the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah to his willingness to sacrifice his own son. His wife, Sarah becomes jealous of the son Abraham had by Hagar, the slave, and forces Abraham to drive Hagar and her son, Ishmael, out into the desert, where they are saved by God. Sarah dies, and Abraham prepares for the end of his own life by searching for a wife for his son, Isaac. The Genesis readings close the week with the story of Isaac's wife, Rebekah, deceiving her now-elderly and blind husband into giving his blessing and birthright to her favored son, Jacob.

Matthew's Gospel follows Jesus on his journeys, constantly teaching his disciples about faithfulness. He challenges his disciples on what it means to follow him. He calms a violent storm at sea and heals two men possessed by demons -- demons who recognize Jesus as the "Son of God." When he is criticized for telling a paralytic his sins were forgiven, Jesus says, "Which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk?'" He then healed the paralytic. On Friday, Jesus does something extraordinary - he invites the reviled tax collector, Matthew, to be one of his followers. Then he indicates that the old ways of relating to God are gone - that he is the new way, the new wineskin.

#### Daily Prayer

The gospels offer us encouragement this week because they are so filled with imperfect people struggling to live out their lives. The invitation to us this week comes from the heart of Jesus to ours: "Follow me." How do we open our hearts more fully to that invitation? In our daily prayer we can name the desire we are looking for and ask Jesus for help.

Each morning as we open our eyes to face the day ahead, we can simply ask Jesus for the courage to follow him.

*Lord, give me the strength today to accept your invitation to follow you. Living that invitation each moment will take patience and courage and I ask you for it because I can't supply it for myself. And, Jesus, when I fail and snap at my family or forget to be compassionate with my spouse, grant me the humility to apologize for that. Let me remember how much you love me and let me share that with everyone who comes into my life today.*

In the smallest moments in the background of our day we can remember that desire and offer it to God. As we walk down the street or cook dinner or run an errand we can speak to our Lord as we would to a friend. It doesn't take more time, only more focus. *Some days it seems like I am being tossed on a boat in the darkness, Jesus. Part of me wants to be saved but another part wants to run from you. I'm not always proud of how I lead my life and sometimes I am afraid to be alone with you. Guide me through this darkness, please.*

At the end of the day, we can take a few moments as we get ready for bed:

*Thank you, dearest Lord, for your presence in my life today. I felt you with me in some of the more difficult moments. Thank you for being there.*

### **Household supplies needed for Family Promise outreach in July**

Holy Trinity Parish in Kuliouou is one of a network of Hawaii congregations participating in Family Promise by providing overnight lodging and meals for three to five families for two weeks every quarter. We have host families for each of the dinners, but could use help in preparation of an entrée, salad or side dish for July 27. We are also seeking monetary donations for household supplies. We will be purchasing household supplies including shower gel, sandwich, quart, 2 gallon plastic bags, size 6 diapers, laundry detergent, toothpaste, liquid hand soap, small containers, Rice (5 lb. bags), garbage bags (33 gallon), microwave lunch containers
