## Breaking open the Word

### 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### Reflection

There is a great lesson we learn from the Gospel story of the little boy who gives away his lunch. That gift was so insignificant to God the creator of the universe, yet the Son of God takes it and multiplies it to feed five thousand.

What does the story of the multiplication of loaves and fish mean in the context of our parish? The story of the boy giving away his lunch may be compared to our smallest gifts, talents and treasure. We all have many small but beautiful gifts we can offer. Who in our parish cannot afford a few minutes of prayer to God each day? Some possess talents for services like lectors, Eucharistic ministers, altar servers; others play the piano, sing in the choir etc. The time you give for these ministries may seem insignificant but the Lord takes your small gifts and multiplies them to nourish us all. Your free will donation in the collection basket is another example of your offering to the Lord. When the Lord takes your gift, he multiplies it to nourish our spiritual hunger in many ways.

What message do we take home this Sunday? 1) We must never underestimate the gifts and talents that the Lord has given us. 2) Those gifts and talents, including our time, are meant to be shared with others in our parish community. 3) The Lord takes those small gifts and multiplies them to nourish us all in the parish.

You are a gift to the parish! You have gifts to share. Your gifts and treasure are precious to the parish. Offer them with joy to the Lord.

## Daily prayer this week

This whole week could be a time for each of us to grow in a sense of what we most deeply desire. If we let Sunday's gospel open our hearts we might find ourselves asking, begging God for what we need.

And we can let the daily gospels renew our hope. This is a good week to get in touch with what is discouraged in our hearts and to let the courage the Lord is offering us renew us. He promises that even small seeds work and that even a little yeast allows dough to grow. The process is sometimes imperceptible, but that's why Jesus reminds us to place our trust in him. Our own hearts might be full of weeds, but the Lord doesn't want us ripping ourselves apart. He is full of mercy and healing reconciliation.

So every day this week, we can begin our day, establishing a focus. One morning we might begin our day simply by saying, "Lord, thank you for this day. Help me to pay attention to what and who I'm treasuring today." Or, "Lord, be with me this day and help me check my need to judge others. Help me place my trust in you today." While driving to work I might talk with the Lord about the day ahead, asking for particular help. During the day, I can let myself have these 30-second friend-to-friend conversations with the Lord. The readings provide a compass for our daily journey, but it is the continual practice at connecting with our Lord that carries us through the day.

## Ministry Fair in August

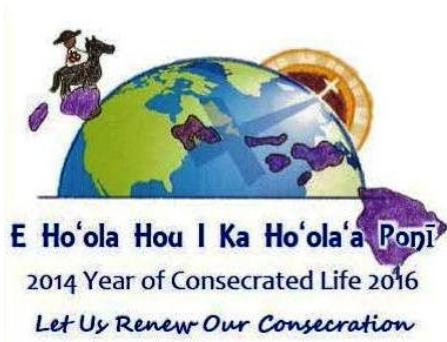

### *Inspirations of love and ministry*

The mission of the planned Damien and Marianne of Molokai Museum is to offer a welcoming environment that engages visitors of diverse backgrounds to learn about the lives of St. Damien and St. Marianne.

There are a number of sponsorship opportunities that will be offered in conjunction with the museum. They include:

#### **Stained glass windows**

-- Nine narrow stained glass windows that reference Kalaupapa in their design will be a prominent architectural feature in the museum. \$60,000.

#### **Interactive exhibits**

-- An interactive exhibit of Damien the Builder, which includes some of Damien's carpentry tools. \$40,000.  
-- Resident voices: Excerpts of oral history interviews with Kalaupapa residents. \$20,000.  
-- Research kiosk: Introduction to available resources and how to use them in locating records of family members sent to Kalaupapa. \$15,000.

#### **Display cases**

-- Textiles: Liturgical vestments and other textiles. \$75,000.  
-- Saints' objects: Personal articles belonging to Mother Marianne and Fr. Damien. \$75,000.

#### **Film presentations**

-- Kalaupapa residents: Portraits and activities of the Kalaupapa community at the beginning of the 20th century. \$60,000.  
-- St. Marianne: Mother Marianne's path to sainthood \$50,000.  
-- St. Damien: Fr. Damien's path to sainthood \$50,000.
