Breaking open the Word

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reflection

Every now and then we hear talk about developing a pill containing all the nourishment we need. The lure of such a pill would be that there would be no more hunger, we wouldn't worry about the weather's impact on agriculture, we would be freed from cooking and cleaning up.

We hear about such a pill, but most of us react quite negatively, even after considering its benefits. We know that there is so much more to nourishment than simply giving the body what it needs to be an efficient living "machine." Eating includes being satisfied, engaging in a social event, choosing a variety of interesting tastes.

This Sunday's gospel, the crowd is seeking Jesus. They have been fed with the bread and fish abundantly provided by Jesus (last Sunday). They want more. What they were not prepared for was that the bread Jesus offers is more than food that satisfies their immediate hunger; it is more than a "pill" that takes care of nourishment needs. The bread the crowd seeks is perishable. They eat this bread but become hungry again. They must keep procuring this bread. The bread Jesus offers is eternal. Those who eat this bread will never hunger again. They cannot procure this bread because it is the Father's gift: the 'true bread from heaven' that is Jesus himself. There is a tension -- a grave misunderstanding -- between what the crowd seeks and what Jesus offers.

What do we seek? Do we seek only nourishment? Or do we seek the Bread only God can give -- Bread that is abundant and Life-giving? God's abundance is a sign of messianic times, of God's reign being established, of eternal Life. Our sharing in this abundance is already a sharing in the fullness of Life to come. The "bread of God...which comes down from heaven.. gives life to the world." We consume the bread from heaven so that the mystery of Life may consume us, drawing us to eternal Life. *Fr. Lane Akiona ss.cc.*



Inspirations of love and ministry

The mission of the planned Damien and Marianne of Molokai Museum is to offer a welcoming environment that engages visitors of diverse backgrounds to learn about the lives of St. Damien and St. Marianne.

There are a number of sponsorship opportunities that will be offered in conjunction with the museum. They include:

Stained glass windows

-- Nine narrow stained glass windows that reference Kalaupapaa in their design will be a prominent architectural feature in the museum. \$60,000.

Interactive exhibits

-- An interactive exhibit of Damien the Builder, which includes some of Damien's carpentry tools. \$40,000.
-- Resident voices: Excerpts of oral history interviews with Kalaupapa residents. \$20,000.
-- Research kiosk: Introduction to available resources and how to use them in locating records of family members sent to Kalaupapa. \$15,000.

Display cases

-- Textiles: Liturgical vestments and other textiles. \$75,000.
-- Saints' objects: Personal articles belonging to Mother Marianne and Fr. Damien. \$75,000.

Film presentations

-- Kalaupapa residents: Portraits and activities of the Kalaupapa community at the beginning of the 20th century. \$60,000.
-- St. Marianne: Mother Marianne's path to sainthood \$50,000.
-- St. Damien: Fr. Damien's path to sainthood \$50,000.
